## in Iowa

Voting is one of the most powerful ways to make your voice heard in our democracy, but in 2024, only 64% of the voting-age population in the United States reported voting.

Modern technology has improved access to information on candidates and made it easier to register to vote in many areas, and it is vital to be aware of how you can participate in the 2026 election cycle.

### PRIMARY ELECTION TYPE:

## Partially Open

This system allows voters to cross party lines, but their ballot selection may be regarded as a form of registration with the corresponding party.



### ABSENTEE AND MAIL-IN VOTING PROCEDURES

#### Permanent absentee/ mail-in voting procedures:

- No excuse required to request an absentee ballot
- Applications can be submitted by mail or in-person

### DEADLINES TO KNOW FOR VOTING IN

### VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE:

**May 18**

15 days before the election; postmarked 15 days before the election for mail registrations. Same-day registration is permitted during in-person absentee voting and on Election Day.

### ABSENTEE / MAIL-IN VOTING BALLOT DEADLINES:

Request must be received by

**May 18**

15 days before an election at 5 PM.

### BALLOT SUBMISSION DEADLINE:

**Mail receipt by Election Day**

Must be received by 8 PM on Election Day.
