Voting is one of the most powerful ways to make your voice heard in our democracy, but in 2024, only 64% of the voting-age population in the United States reported voting.

Modern technology has improved access to information on candidates and made it easier to register to vote in many areas, and it is vital to be aware of how you can participate in the 2026 election cycle.

PRIMARY ELECTION TYPE:

Open

In an open primary, voters may choose privately in which primary to vote and do not need to register with the party to vote in their primary. This system permits a voter to cast a vote across party lines for the primary election if they choose.



ABSENTEE AND MAIL-IN VOTING PROCEDURES

Permanent absentee/ mail-in voting procedures:

- No excuse required to request an absentee ballot
- Applications can be submitted by mail, in-person, email, fax, or online

DEADLINES TO KNOW FOR VOTING IN

Wisconsin



VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE:

July 22

20 days before the election if registering online or by mail. Friday before the election if registering in-person. Same-day registration is permitted on Election Day.

ABSENTEE / MAIL-IN VOTING BALLOT DEADLINES:

Request must be received by

August 6

5 days before the election for online or mail requests; the Sunday before the election for in-person requests.

BALLOT SUBMISSION DEADLINE:

Mail receipt by
Election Day

Must be received by 8 PM on Election Day.
